## Course Overview

The HLT54121 Diploma of Nursing represents the vital role of an enrolled nurse, working under the supervision of a registered nurse to provide compassionate care across all stages of life.

To become a registered enrolled nurse in Australia, candidates must complete a Diploma of Nursing program accredited by the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council (ANMAC) and recognized by the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA).

The scope of practice for enrolled nurses is defined by legislative requirements and organizational policies, ensuring a supportive environment for professional growth. This qualification fulfills the NMBA's registration requirements, enabling you to make a meaningful impact as an enrolled nurse.

## Mode of Delivery

### Blended

Blended delivery mode will be achieved through online theory with face-to-face simulation-based practice and professional experience placement (PEP) at relevant workplaces.

### Face-to-Face

Face-to-face delivery will be achieved through on-campus lectures, tutorials, simulation-based practice, and professional experience placement (PEP) at relevant workplaces.



## Credit Transfer (CT)

Credit transfer for HLTENN units is exclusively available to students who have successfully completed a Diploma of Nursing program accredited by the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council (ANMAC) and approved by the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA).

## Professional Experience Placement (PEP) requirements

- Valid and current National Police Clearance (NPC) or Australian Federal Police (AFP) Clearance certificate
- Required immunisation
- Working with Children Check (WWCC)\*
- A valid NDIS Worker Screening Check

*\*Working with Children Check, which may be referred to by different names in various Australian states and territories.*

## Entry Requirements

There are no prerequisites or any other training package entry requirements for this course.

## IHNA Admission Requirements:

- Successful completion of year 12 or pathway through certificate III or IV level qualification from the HLT or CHC training package\*
- 18 years of age and above at the time of commencement of the course
- Successful completion of the language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) test and demonstration of competence level as exit level 3 in the Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF) in both reading and numeracy
- NMBA specified level of English language skills

\*Mature age individuals (22+) who may not have completed year 12 but have significant work experience in the health sector and who meet the LLN requirements may also be considered for enrolment.

## Language, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital (LLND) Requirement
